**As proof of your date of birth, you can submit to OPERS one of the following documents.
Documents cannot be returned to you. You may submit legible copies.**

- A certified birth certificate
- Notification of registration of birth in a public registry of vital statistics
- Hospital birth record made before you were 5 years old certified by the custodian of such record
- A foreign government record giving your date of birth or a foreign birth certificate certified by the custodian of such record
- Naturalization record
- U.S. passport
- If you have provided the Social Security Administration with sufficient proof of birth date, a signed letter from the Social Security Administration giving your date of birth, as shown by their records

If you do not have any one of the documents listed above, you may submit two of the documents below.

- Military record giving your date of birth
- Religious record of your birth or your age made before you were 3 months old certified by a custodian of such record
- Certification of record of age by the United States Census Bureau giving your date of birth
- Marriage record showing date of birth certified by the custodian of such record

The name on any document(s) you submit must be the same as the name you provided to OPERS. If different, you will be required to submit further proof of your identification. Furthermore, the date of birth on the document(s) you submit must be the same as the date of birth you provided.

OPERS reserves the right to reject any document the validity of which is in question.

“Any person who shall knowingly make false statements, or who shall falsify or permit to be falsified any record necessary for carrying out the intent of the Retirement System law for the purpose of committing fraud, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) or by imprisonment for not exceeding one (1) year . . .” (74 O.S. § 924, as amended).
